

WHAT'S NEW AT ERIE STATION BUSINESS PARK

It's not uncommon for any major expansion or construction project to experience challenges or changes to plans along the way. From unpredictable Rochester winters to marketplace dynamics that impact how a space will be used, the key to success lies in teamwork and open communication. The recently completed CooperVision expansion is a textbook example of both.

The global growth of CooperVision over the last several years compelled the company to expand its packaging and distribution facilities. Based on its commitment to the Rochester region, they decided to expand their existing facility at Erie Station Business Park by adding 163,000 square feet of space. This was coupled with substantial investments in technology and systems for packaging, storage, and order picking.

From the design phase through construction, Konar Properties and the team at CooperVision met weekly to ensure the project's success. Reflecting on those meetings, Jim Fiorino, Sr. Director Distribution Operations at CooperVision shared, "The strength of our relationship with Konar Properties and the transparency we had in those meetings really kept us in line. If there was something that was potentially slipping, we were able to get ahead of it quickly."

Fiorino appreciated how Konar Properties' relationships with the Town of Henrietta, New York State, and a diverse range of vendors – from lighting to

landscaping — helped ensure CooperVision's plan for its new facility became a reality. That includes the special requirements needed for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for the facility, which is powered by 100% renewable energy.

Between the June 2022 groundbreaking and August 2023 when the Certificate of Occupancy was granted, CooperVision experienced changes in its global CONTINUED INSIDE >

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business that led to a shift in how the new space would be used before it was even completed. Originally planned as a blended packaging and distribution facility, increased consumer use of daily wear contact lenses led the company to quickly pivot and devote a larger portion of the space to packaging than originally planned. The frequent and open communication between Konar Properties and CooperVision helped ensure that any changes needed throughout construction would never cause delays.

In addition to expanding its facility, CooperVision took the step of acquiring both their building and land. When the company first moved to Erie Station Business Park in 2005, Konar Properties built the 241,600-square-

foot packaging and distribution center and leased the facility to CooperVision. With the decision to expand, they determined that full ownership fit best with their strategic plan. The transfer of ownership was finalized in September 2023.

Change is a part of every company's survival; Konar Properties works to anticipate those changes and help companies plan for continued success. From the amount and type of space needed to lease terms and purchase options, Konar Properties partners with businesses to help them change as their needs do.

Erie Station Business Park has sites available for sale or build-to-suit solutions, ranging from four to 22 acres. ERIE STATION BUSINESS PARK: Vuzix Expands into Second Flex Space

Vuzix, an industry leader in augmented reality (AR) technology, has seen explosive growth since they first moved to Erie Station Business Park in 2015. As it became clear that they were outgrowing their existing space, they made the decision to take on additional square footage in a neighboring flex space building and create a world-class specialty manufacturing facility.

Vuzix designs and manufactures optical components, waveguides, smart glasses, and AR solutions for defense, security, and enterprise clients around the globe. The nature of their work demands environments where temperature, humidity, and air filtering are highly controlled.

The expansion was completed in September and features offices as well as cleanroom space for manufacturing. According to Kreag Bradley,

Sr. Manufacturing Engineer, "The new building will not only meet Vuzix's current needs, but will also provide the opportunity to take on additional space as the demand for waveguide production increases." Optical waveguides bend and combine light in a way that creates the virtual images someone wearing smart glasses sees overlayed on the real world. Building out a space that accomodates that level of specialized manufacturing requires careful planning and a highly skilled team.

Throughout the planning and build-out of their new space, Konar Properties met with Vuzix and the various contractors involved at least weekly to ensure open communication and collaboration between everyone. Bradley shared "They were professional and organized. I appreciated their input and felt

they always asked smart questions, based on their experience with other similar build-outs."

Flex space is the perfect fit for Vuzix because a single building can be configured for multiple functions, like cleanrooms, offices, packaging, loading docks, and more. When Marilla's Mindful Supplies realized their Geneva-based store had a significant customer base coming from Rochester, they took the opportunity to expand.

Frustrated that her favorite eco-friendly brands and shops relied on single-use plastic packaging, Marilla Gonzalez decided in 2019 to open a store where you could shop for bulk food, personal care items, and home supplies without plastic packaging. Customers of Marilla's Mindful Supplies use their own containers, or the plastic-free ones provided by the store at no cost, making it easy to be planet-friendly.

From the moment her Geneva store opened, Marilla hoped to open a second location in a more populous area. Even though the arrival of the pandemic slowed those aspirations, the store experienced a steady increase in sales that gave her confidence in the business concept. A significant part of that growth came from customers in Rochester who were visiting the Geneva store at least monthly. When the numbers looked favorable for expansion, she began searching for possible locations.

While Marilla considered a long list of locations around Rochester, she ultimately settled on the South Wedge because it closely resembled the neighborhood where her Geneva store is located. Both are livable, walkable neighborhoods that share similar demographics and values. And both are dominated by small, local
